Are you a college undergraduate interested in climate services? Want to experience an entrepreneurial environment? Want the chance to work alongside scientists *and* business people? **Look no further than The Collider, an innovation center in downtown Asheville focused on climate solutions.**

### What is The Collider?

The Collider is a nonprofit innovation center focused on catalyzing market-driven climate solutions. Never has the need been greater to connect business, technology, and science to provide climate solutions. Our physical home in downtown Asheville, NC, is a cowork, education and event space that exists to grow the emerging climate services industry.

### What is Destination Space?

Destination Space will cultivate a long-term interest in STEM by providing an engaging, hands-on remote sensing educational opportunity for high school students. Satellite remote sensing provides a vast range of uses to analyze and potentially mitigate local and global environmental issues and has an even larger potential to expand to a wider variety of applications in the near future. Destination Space inspires and empowers students to develop into capable scientists and become the next generation of STEM leaders.

### What will I do at this internship?

You will work with the Destination Space team to help organize and track our deliverables and progress for the following projects (among others):

- Pre-satellite week space camp for younger students, and potentially one for adults.
- Climate solutions camp and young "Climate Ambassadors"
- ThinSat STEM program's high-altitude balloon launch in March/April, and the Antares rocket launch from NASA's Wallops Island facility in the Fall of 2018.
- Amelia Earhart STEM project with student presentations at the Collider in late January 2018.

In addition to the valuable experience of learning the business of climate at a beautiful new innovation center in downtown Asheville, interns are welcome and encouraged to attend events at The Collider, such as Beer City Science Pubs, presentations on the impacts of climate change, and our weekly coffee hour social for the climate services community, known as the PercCollider.

### Requirements:

- Currently working towards a two-year, four-year, or graduate degree.
- Ability to physically be at The Collider a minimum of two days a week.

Hours: 10-12/week Pay: \$12/hour Duration: 10 weeks over the course of a semester.
